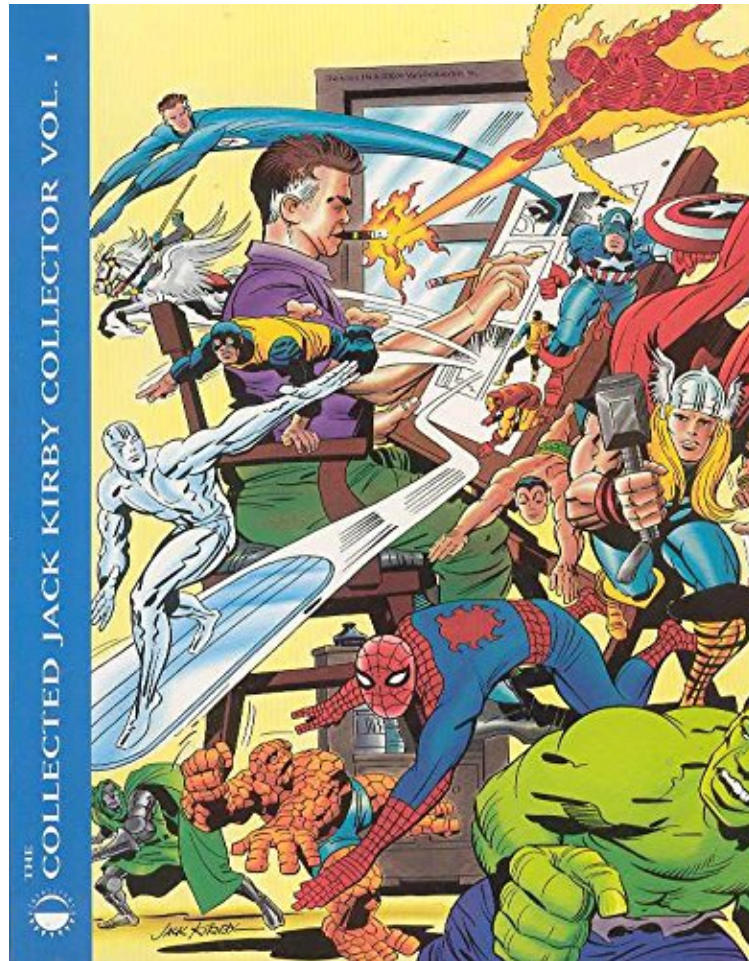

Obviously, this book is meant for people that live and breathe Kirby, but even someone with a casual interest will gain something from this book.
