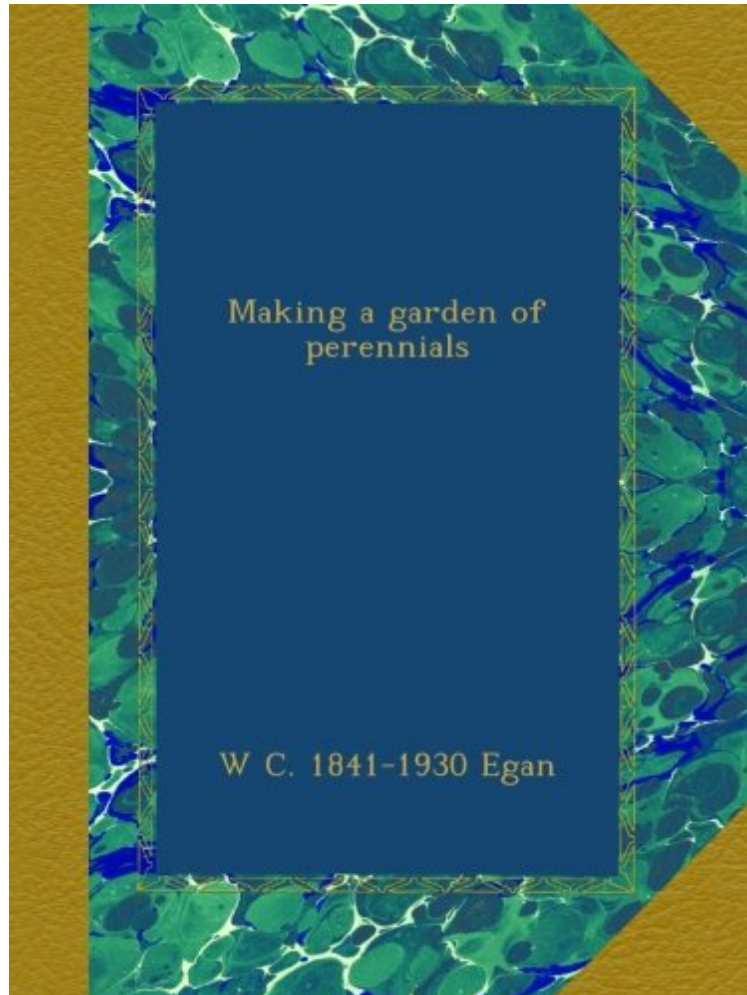

Also, it suggested using fresh manure in the bottom of beds, which conflicts with what I know about effective composting.
