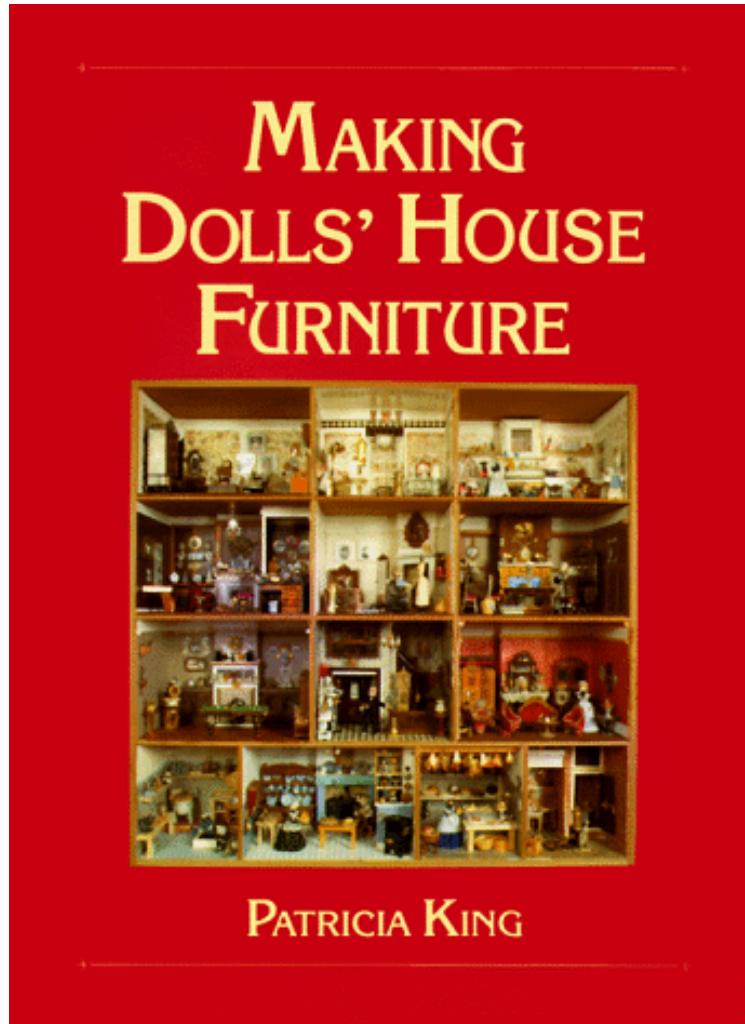

She wanted readers to be aware that you can make miniature objects out of things in your home. Miniatures don't have to be an expensive hobby. She gives lots of great ideas for making all kinds of fixtures and furniture for roomboxes and dollhouses. Many color photos are included although the majority of the pictures are black and white.My main complaint about the book are the displays she used to show her miniatures. Her themes were victorian so she embellished her pieces with a lot of overly ornate

materials. I really didn't like her roomboxes because they looked way too cluttered even for the period she chose. They looked gaudy and sometimes juvenile. Still the book is worth a look because of her emphasis on resourcefulness, but do try to borrow it at the library or buy it used.
